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10.06.2024 with a heading 'Woman delivers baby on floor in Ambik SHC'.




The said news report states that a 25 years old pregnant woman delivered her baby on the floor at the Navanagar Sub Health Centre in Surguja District (Ambikapur) on 08.06.2024 and that too, in absence of any Doctor or Nurse. The said lady, on experiencing labour pain arrived at Sub Health Centre alongwith Mitanin (Community Health Worker) but neither any Doctor nor any nurse was present and the lady had to deliver the baby on the floor of the Sub Health Centre. The family members of the lady tried to contact the medical staff which remained unresponded and as such the Mitanin helped in delivering the baby. Even the postnatal care was taken by the traditional midwife from the village because only a Class IV employee was available at the said Health Centre. The aforesaid news report further goes to state that it was not the first occasion where such incident had happened.

It is a very sorry state of affair if the aforesaid is the situation prevailing at Sub Health Centre, Navanagar, Ambikapur. When the State Government is incurring a huge amount of money for providing medical facilities to the public at large residing in the remotest part of the State, and the authorities and the staff who are responsible to manage the affairs of the Health Centres are themselves are absent and missing when they are needed the most, the State ought to take some stringent measures.

Mr. Yashwant Singh Thakur, learned Additional Advocate General states that action has been taken against the concerned Medical Officer and an enquiry has been ordered and he has been placed under suspension with immediate effect. So far as the nurse, who was on duty is reported to have met with an accident, however, no documents with

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respect to the same has been filed.
